CRITICAL PERSPECTIVES IN THEATRE

Critical engagement with the myriad theatrical traditions of the world, including using selected historical and contemporary analyses that illuminate key aspects of the works and the corresponding dramatic traditions. There is a special focus on the themes of performing faith, dramatizing identity, and staging power.

IDEA OF THEATRE

Through readings, research, discussions, and interactions with Indianapolis artists and institutions, students acquire a critical foundation for understanding theatre on a local and global level as well as developing an historical and contemporary perspective on the nature of theatre.

LATINA/O/E/X THEATRE

Investigates Latina/o/e/x plays and playwrights in (generally) North America from the mid-twentieth century to today. The course further interrogates this theatre through critical consideration of and engagement with a variety of criticism and theories.

PERSPECTIVES IN THE CREATIVE ARTS

Investigates the various genres of the visual and performing arts in relation to community and contemporary society. Students learn to appreciate, explore, and accept a wide framework of artistic endeavors and understand the role of the arts in their lives, communities, and the world they live in.

STAGE COMBAT

Covers the Society of American Fight Directors' fighting principles, theories, and techniques of unarmed and single sword combat. In a structured, safe environment students use weapons and/or the body create the illusion of physical violence to: tell a story and to convey to the audience who is the aggressor and who is the victim.

TEXT ANALYSIS

Trains students in techniques and approaches used for analyzing dramatic texts. The class considers the roles structure, genre, and social and historical context serve in the script analysis process and takes into consideration how various theories of theatre can be applied to the understanding of a dramatic text.

SCRIPT ANALYSIS FOR THEATRE 2014-2017, 2019

Trains students in techniques and approaches used for analyzing dramatic texts. INTRODUCTION TO THEATRE (team taught) 2013-2016

Investigates the dynamics of theatre production through plays, theatrical space, and historical and cultural context, with particular attention to the roles of the audience, playwrights, directors, actors, designers, producers, and critics.

PUBLIC ORAL COMMUNICATION 2015-2016

Studies approaches to and methods of public speaking grounded in theories centered on audience perspectives and values. Understands the importance and use of pathos, ethos, and logos to construct and deliver an effective speech, regardless of the topic and audience composition.
